

BE A DROUGHT CHAMP!



PREVENT FIRE HAZARDS

Prevent lawns from becoming fire hazards during a drought by keeping grass cut between 3" - 4" tall, removing dead weeds and vegetation and clearing debris.

SPRINKLER TIPS

Adjust sprinklers to prevent runoff onto sidewalks and driveways. Replace old sprinkler heads for maximum water efficiency.

WHY SAVE YOUR TREES?

Trees produce clean air and create shade, which lowers energy bills and helps lawns retain water. Check trees by inserting a small shovel or screw driver into the soil. If it's dry and crumbly, it's time to water. Soak the soil beneath and beyond the edge of the leaf canopy until it feels sticky and wet. Add mulch around the base to retain moisture.

POOL TIPS

Reduce evaporation by shutting off fountains and waterfalls, lowering pool temperature and installing a pool cover. Check for leaks and plug the overflow line when not in use. Keep pool clean and do not overfill.
